As our first term as Harris Science Academy comes to an end, I want to thank you all for your support and patience while we have implemented so many improvements to the school. There have been some bumps along the way and we know there will be more, but we are starting to get some consistency across the school now in terms of our communications with you and in aligning school routines with the Harris Federation model.

Christmas Celebrations - Music Concert and Pantomime

It was wonderful to see the return of the end of term pantomime, Cinderella, which we ran for the first time since the pandemic. We were delighted with how well this went down with all pupils and staff, showing the tremendous spirit that runs through the school even in times of change. General communications

We now have Bromcom set up as the central data communication tool and have also managed to set up a texting system for important and urgent messages. This has helped improve communications that were falling between the old ELSS email account and the new HSAEL accounts. Thanks for your patience while we sorted this out and we hope you are experiencing the improved communication.

Custom House and Clock Mill improvements

For those of you with children in the 6th Form, you will have heard that the new Custom House building is open now and our next steps will be to make sure it is set up for independent study to ensure your children can work around the clock at all times on their studies.

We were excited to welcome Lord Harris just before Christmas to the Custom House building. It was great for him to see some of the improvements in place since the Harris Federation transition began. We are also making some changes to the reception area at Clock Mill to improve security and there will be some other improvements to make the site safer.

Learning Spaces, Exams and Year 10 Parent Information Evening January 5th 5-6.30pm

In terms of learning, we are also trying to quickly improve the books we offer to support our literacy programme and expect to have good news soon about a new and improved library space.

We have completed our first set of mock exams with Harris support in years 11 and 13 and these have gone well, and we hope to hac results, feedback and progress reports ready very soon in January (and in most cases, before the Christmas break) to support your children in their next steps towards GCSE and A-levels.

The next focus point for us is Year 10, and we have had some teething problems with setting up their end of term exams as we tried to work with Harris and our own internal exam processes. This has led to delays in communication with you and your children about exam timetables and revision guides and has also meant we have not been able to use the hall as we wished to. As you know a big part of doing well at exams is clear modelling of actual processes, but lack of space meant we were not able to use the Hall for the Year 10 or Year 8 exams. However, as we recognise the vital importance of Year 10 at this stage of their studies, we are running a Year 10 parent Information Evening on Thursday January 5th 2023 between 5 and 6.30pm to keep you updated on the next steps for the year group. A letter has been sent out on Friday 16th December, the last day of term. Mr. Perkins will be in touch with more information about this evening shortly.

Teaching and Learning and Curriculum Review

Back in the classroom, we are reviewing our teaching and learning and monitoring the effectiveness of the new routines from the first term to support learning. Please do get in touch with Mr. Martin if you have any queries about this. We will shortly be assessing curriculum and timetable to support learning and if your child is in Year 11 you will already know about the day extensions to 4.20 to ensure full coverage in all option subjects as well as the Saturday revision classes we have been running this half-term. Thanks to Miss Newson for her work on Saturdays to get our Year 11s into school and doing the extra work to build their chances next summer.

We continue to have teaching support from colleagues from the Harris Federation to ensure your pupils have had a calm and focused first term and have new lead practitioners starting in January in Physics and Maths. As much as possible, we have tried to sustain the existing curriculum and we are also looking at how to meet national curriculum expectations across the board. We are working hard to keep the academic offer as high as it was before the summer but with a more targeted focus on ensuring every child makes the progress they are capable of, including those with special educational needs.

Sign up for hot meals

One of the highlights of the past term has been seeing our new catering service get up and running, with more than half of students already enjoying a tasty, high quality and nutritious hot lunch each day. We have appointed Thomas Franks, a family-run firm of caterers, to

provide the catering. The menu changes from week to week so as to provide variety for students, but typically they can choose from a jacket potato and pasta each day, or have the 'dish of the day', such as stew or stir-fried noodles. Puddings include treats such as flapjacks and a range of freshly made cakes.

The cost is £2.38 per day, but it is free for children who qualify for Free School Meals.

A hot and healthy meal at lunch time gives students a terrific boost before their afternoon studies. For those of you that have already heard from us but have not yet signed up we will be in touch over the break to advise you of the process to sign up for parent pay our cashless payment system and to get your biometric registration consent if you wish to go ahead with that so that your child can get hot food in the new year when we go live with cashless payments.

Parent Pay and cashless payments - new go live date - January 4th 2023

Unfortunately, we did not manage to get cashless payments working this term for our new food service but at the time of writing this newsletter we have now had the final technological glitches fixed and so we are confirming that the new go live date for cashless payment is Wednesday January 4th, the first day back in the new year for your children. By that time we hope to have biometric registration completed or PIN number equivalent for those of you who have not consented. So as long as you have completed Parent Pay registration by then, and uploaded money on to the system, your child should be able to get their food on site from the start of the new term. A reminder that to use the cashless system you need to register for Parent Pay and set up your Parent Pay account as well as return your biometric consent forms to reception. Please advise any queries on this to your Head of Year in the first instance.
