Return to the Academy

The summer term begins for all students on **Monday 15th April** promptly at **8.25am**. The Academy Day begins at **Clock Mill** for all students with a line up for Year 7-11 and a briefing for the sixth form. Staff will complete a full uniform and equipment check. Please give your support to this by ensuring your child has the correct equipment and is in full Academy uniform. We will contact parents for any uniform or equipment snagging issues and students with incorrect uniform may not enter circulation until these are rectified. Staff will check that students have completed their holiday homework during period 1, while they participate in the termly 'welcome back' assembly. Students who have completed their homework will receive positive £HSAEL, with a rewards event planned for all students who pass their termly knowledge checks. Students who have not completed their homework will not enter circulation until this has been completed.

These events will provide us with additional opportunities to celebrate and recognise the exceptional efforts of our students at Harris Science Academy.

Reflections are now interventions

Homework holds significant importance and should be a priority for all students. Those who consistently complete homework and engage in regular revision tend to perform better in exams and enhance their understanding of subjects.

Moving forward, we will introduce two separate interventions at the end of the day: one focusing on behaviour and the other on homework. The behaviour intervention aims to provide students with an opportunity to reflect on any wrong choices made throughout the day. Concurrently, the academic intervention is designed to ensure that students have the necessary support to complete any pending homework assigned by their teachers.

Attendance

We cannot celebrate your children if not at the Academy. Research suggests students with less than 95% attendance less of a connection with school, which affects their happiness and wellbeing. must attend every day unless they are which case parents or carers must Academy before 9am on each morning

We aim for every pupil to have 100% attendance, as missing 1 day of school 6 hours of missed learning. A pupil will hours behind their peers if they miss 4 school and finish the year on 98% attendance.

Home Learning



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This term, we are continuing our work to ensure that students know and remember what they have learned in every subject. Over the half-term, students will continue to embed key terms into their long-term memory, using the Look, Cover, Write, Check (LCWC) method. Details of the method can be found in their booklets, and I have copied the method below.

Students were provided with the booklet on Monday 25th March. Further to this, the booklets can be found on our website here and on each student's MCAS.

Students must have completed at least one page of LCWC, with attempts of each key term per subject. If homework is not completed, students will not go into lessons until it is done. This serves to maintain the Academy's firm stance on raising academic standards, taking responsibility for one's learning and the importance of scholarship.

In the first lesson back for each subject, students will be tested on the subject's key terms. Students must achieve a minimum of 65% to pass. Teachers will use this to know if there is any material to be retaught or knowledge to go over before any new content is taught.

Students who have passed all but one test will get a golden ticket to the Knowledge Party, where we will celebrate their hard work and achievements! Students will be provided with food and have a range of activities to enjoy as a reward for their accomplishments.

The Look, Cover, Write, Check Method:

How students should self-quiz.

- Look at no more than 5 terms at a time.
- Read the terms and say them repeatedly in their head (without speaking aloud) for 2-3 minutes.
- Cover the terms on the following pages with an exercise book, with a black pen, write down as many terms and definitions as they remember.
- With a blue pen, cover the term and check they have correctly spelled and defined each term. Refine spelling and definition in blue.
- Spend 2-3 minutes reading the terms again and saying them in their head.
- Fold you piece of paper so they cannot see the first round of quizzing, cover the terms and wite down as many terms and definitions as they remember.
- With a blue pen, cover the term and check they have correctly spelled and defined each term. Refine spelling and definition in blue.
- Repeat this process until they correctly spell and define each term.
- If you run out of space in your quizzing book, you should use lined paper to complete your self-quizzing.

Spring Exams

Years 11, and 13 have all sat their final set of mock exams before their public exams begin. There have been several positive outcomes, and we are proud of the effort students put into their exams. Based on the results data, there are several changes for April.

- Y11 intervention will take place on weekday mornings from 8.00am-8.50am, as we know this is where we will have the most impact.
- Y11s have been given the opportunity to stay in Independent Study until 5pm.
- Some Y11s will have compulsory intervention and ISP to support their growth.

Leadership Development Time:
