## Exemplary Behaviour: Because it's who we are

We had a positive end to the autumn term where we handed out over 400 certificates to celebrate the top 20 pupils that achieved over 350 positive points, best in subject, 100% attendance and embody 'LEADERS' and 'GRACE' every day.



## **Attendance**

Excellent attendance is the expectation at HSAEL. Students must attend every day unless they are unwell, in which case parents or carers must contact the Academy before 9am on each morning of absence. We aim for every pupil to have 100% attendance, as missing 1 day of school equates to 6 hours of missed learning. A pupil will be 24 hours behind their peers if they miss 4 days of school and finish the year on 98% attendance.

## **Uniform**

All HSAEL pupils must attend school in the correct school uniform. You can revisit the uniform policy here. I would like to draw your attention to the below elements:

• The uniform is not gendered. Students may wear either trousers or a skirt. If they choose to wear trousers, these should be in a standard fit and worn at

the waist. If they choose to wear a skirt, it must cover the knee for the duration of the day.

- Students in Years 7-11 are not permitted to wear makeup, including nail varnish or hair extensions.
- Jewellery or piercings are not allowed for students in Years 7-11.

Sixth form students should wear smart business wear and are permitted to wear a single gold or silver stud earing in each earlobe.

### Equipment

Students must be ready to learn when they arrive at school each day. They must be fully equipped with all the tools they will need to be successful. There are some additions to the equipment list, which have been highlighted in bold. The Academy compulsory equipment list is:

- A clear pencil case.
- A minimum of 2 x black pens.
- 1 x blue pen
- 1 x green pen
- 1 x red pen
- 1 x whiteboard pen
- A glue stick
- A ruler
- 1 x HB pencil
- 1 x rubber
- A mathematics set (protractor and compasses).
- A reading book

Students may purchase equipment at a reduced price from the school reception before school each day or from the Clock Mill library at lunch time and after school.

#### Banned items

We are committed to keeping our Academy safe and free from harmful or distracting items so that our sole focus is on learning. The below items are therefore not permitted under any circumstances in the Academy:

- Mobile phones
- Fizzy drinks and sweets
- Personal gaming devices
- Vaping devices/ e-cigarettes

A full list of banned items can be found on our website. Under common law, Academy staff have the power to search for any item if a pupil agrees and the Academy may conduct targeted, random searches to ensure the above items are not brought into the Academy. Banned items will be confiscated for a period of 6 weeks before parents or carers are invited into the Academy to collect the item.

### An Academic Curriculum for every child

Every child at HSAEL has the right to a traditional and rigorous curriculum, rooted in academia; a curriculum that creates leaders.

The HSAEL curriculum aims to enact our mission that every student will be a leader in their chosen field, with many choosing to be leaders of STEM. It is through our well taught

academic curriculum that we will ensure that every student will leave HSAEL with the academic currency to gain entry to elite universities and professional careers.

## Home Learning

To embed core knowledge into their long-term memory, and to build skills students will need in the future, we know that independent and home learning is necessary. To ensure students have embedded and mastered their learning from the autumn term, each subject has set core knowledge homework which has been taught throughout the term.

Students were provided with the booklet on Thursday 21st December. Further to this, the booklets can be found on our website <a href="here">here</a> and on each student's MCAS. Students are to use the Look, Cover, Write, Check method to make sure the information becomes embedded in their long-term memory. Details of the method can be found in their booklets, and I have copied the method below.

Students must have completed at least one page of LCWC per subject. If homework is not completed, students will not go into lessons until it is done. This serves to maintain the Academy's firm stance on raising academic standards, taking responsibility for one's learning and the importance of scholarship. In the first lesson back for each subject, students will be tested on the subject's key terms. Students must achieve a minimum of 50% to pass. Teachers will use this to know if there is any material to be retaught or knowledge to go over before any new content is taught.

# How students should self-quiz

- Look at no more than 5 terms at a time.
- Read the terms and say them over and over again in their head (without speaking aloud) for 2-3 minutes.
- Cover the terms on the following pages with an exercise book, with a black pen, write down as many terms and definitions as they remember.
- With a blue pen, cover the term and check they have correctly spelled and defined each term. Refine spelling and definition in blue.
- Spend 2-3 minutes reading the terms again and saying them in their head.
- Fold you piece of paper so they cannot see the first round of quizzing, cover the terms and wite down as many terms and definitions as they remember.
- With a blue pen, cover the term and check they have correctly spelled and defined each term. Refine spelling and definition in blue.
- Repeat this process until they correctly spell and define each term.
- If you run out of space in your quizzing book, you should use lined paper to complete your self-quizzing.

#### **Autumn Exams**

Years 10, 11, and 13 have all sat their mock exams. There have been several positive outcomes, and we are proud of the effort students put into their exams. Based on the results data, there are several changes for January.

- Some students in Y10 and Y11 will be withdrawn from specific options subjects and placed in extra English and Maths lessons to support their success in their best 8 GCSE exams.
- Y11 intervention will take place on weekday mornings from 8.00am-8.50am, as we know this is where we will have the most impact.
- Tiered subjects are using results to ensure each student is in the right tier.
- Y13 students will have extra time in their subjects in order to maximise progress.
