# Exemplary Behaviour: Because it's who we are

For children to become leaders in their chosen field, every second matters at the Academy. Our expectations for exemplary behaviour help students to be the best version of themselves and to embody the traits of graceful leadership that will enable them to have a powerful impact in the future. High expectations are an act of care for our students. The Academy has a

compelling reward system for students, the HSAEL Pay Check system, which will offer students the choice of regular rewards throughout the year. You can track your child's rewards using the MCAS app.

Your child will receive a full induction on our behaviour norms in September, which will include explicit practice in how we move around our unique buildings and the ingredients for exemplary behaviour for learning in the classroom. We hope this will give everyone an opportunity to get used to teachers' expectations in a safe and supportive environment before lessons begin. We know that everybody makes mistakes and that this is an important part of growing up. The system of reflections enables children to take responsibility for these mistakes, think about what happened and then plan what they would do differently next time. You can also see these on the MCAS app.

#### **Attendance**

Excellent attendance is the expectation at HSAEL. Students must attend every day unless they are unwell, in which case parents or carers must contact the Academy <u>before 9am</u> on each morning of absence.

We aim for every pupil to have 100% attendance, as missing 1 day of school equates to 6 hours of missed learning. A pupil will be 28 hours behind their peers if they miss 4 days of school and finish the year on 98% attendance.

#### **Uniform and Equipment**

We are excited to see your child wearing their new HSAEL uniform. Uniform is an important part of a school's identity. It reinforces who we are as a community and helps allow students to feel pride in their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for work.

Please familiarise yourself with our uniform expectations, by reading the uniform policy <u>here</u>. I would like to draw your attention to the below elements:

- The uniform is not gendered. Students may wear either trousers or a skirt. If they choose to wear trousers, these should be in a standard fit and worn at the waist. If they choose to wear a skirt, this should be a skirt provided from the uniform supplier and worn such that it covers the knee.
- Students in Years 7-11 are not permitted to wear makeup, including nail varnish or hair extensions.
- Jewellery or piercings are not allowed for students in Years 7-11.

Sixth form students should wear smart business wear and are permitted to wear a single gold or silver stud earing in each earlobe.

Students must be ready to learn when they arrive at school each day. They must be fully equipped with all the tools they will need to be successful. The Academy compulsory equipment list is:

- A clear pencil case.
- A minimum of 2 x black pens.
- 1 x blue pen
- 1 x green pen
- 1 x red pen
- A glue stick
- A ruler
- 1 x HB pencil
- 1 x rubber
- A mathematics set (protractor and compasses).

Students may purchase equipment at a reduced price from the school reception before school each day or from the Clock Mill library at lunch time and after school.

#### **Banned Items**

We are committed to keeping our Academy safe and free from harmful or distracting items so that our sole focus is on learning. The below items are therefore not permitted under any circumstances in the Academy:

- Mobile phones
- Fizzy drinks and sweets
- Personal gaming devices
- Vaping devices/ e-cigarettes
- Permanent markers and spray paints.

A full list of banned items can be found on our website. Under common law, Academy staff have the power to search for any item if a pupil agrees and the Academy may conduct targeted, random searches to ensure the above items are not brought into the Academy. Banned items will be confiscated for a period of 6 weeks before parents or carers are invited into the Academy to collect the item.

## An Academic Curriculum for every child

Every child at HSAEL has the right to a traditional and rigorous curriculum, rooted in academia; a curriculum that creates leaders.

The HSAEL curriculum aims to enact our mission that every student will be a leader in their chosen field, with many choosing to be leaders of STEM. It is through our well taught, academic curriculum that we will ensure that every student will leave HSAEL with the academic currency to gain entry to elite universities and professional careers.

The intent of the HSAEL curriculum is to embody our values:

- Encouraging growth ensuring students receive feedback regularly and building resilience.
- Instilling a sense of responsibility through independence and making decisions that will improve their own academic experience.
- Promoting ambition a rigorous curriculum that enables students to achieve the highest grades and access leadership opportunities and elite careers and universities.

- Fostering compassion placing knowledge in the context of the wider world and creating an understanding of different perspectives.
- Cultivating excellence creating consistent habits in gaining knowledge and a pursuit of the mastery of every subject.

Every department is passionate about their subject and wants to create leaders in their subject areas. With this in mind, when planning the curriculum, they begin with an understanding of the knowledge that students will be required to have in order to access elite universities in the U.K. regardless of their starting point. It is the greatest honour to have students choose your subject at university level and become a leader in that area.

Our lesson structure ensures students become independent and confident in their own learning. Every lesson is structured in the same way to ensure students learn and remember more. The HSAEL lesson structure is as follows:

Read Now	Students are provided with knowledge in context, with the big idea of the lesson considered; fundamentally, this will give students more knowledge to access the lesson, as well as build literacy skills.
Daily Review	Students respond to questions that rely on knowledge recall and prior learning. This will connect their current lesson to previous lessons. This also serves to support embedding knowledge in their long-term memory.
Exposition	Metacognitive steps which are planned by the teacher, using their expertise to ensure everyone can move on to the deliberate practice.
Deliberate practice	Time spent applying students' prior knowledge as well as new knowledge from the exposition into their work.

To embed core knowledge into their long-term memory, and to build skills students will need in the future, we know that independent and home learning is necessary. In every subject, students will be given core knowledge to learn and master independently. Students will be tested weekly on this knowledge, so that teachers can check for mastery. Both students and parents will be able to access the assigned home learning through MCAS.

Finally, to fulfil our mission in ensuring every HSAEL student is a leader in their chosen field, we need to understand how your children learn best. During the first half-term, every student will sit the following baseline assessments:

## **Character Education**

Character Education is an important part of academy life with our aim to help students develop the character to lead in often closed and competitive environments and make a positive contribution to their community. Students will have regular opportunities to develop their cultural capital through our 12 Character Educations days on the last two days of each half term. These days will include the following:

- Public speaking and debating workshops
- Careers experiences
- Science days
- Museum and art gallery visits
- Teambuilding opportunities
- Residentials

In addition to these days off timetable we will have an extensive enrichment programme helping students to develop lifelong interests and passions. These clubs will run before the academy day, at lunchtime and at the end of the day, with students having the opportunity to sign up to these clubs at the enrichment fair at the start of term.

On alternate weeks students will engage in Leadership Development Time which will support the delivery of PSHE to equip our students with the knowledge and experiences they need to live healthy, happy, safe and fulfilling lives. In addition to PSHE we will also host house competitions during this time where students can compete in various activities to gain points for their house.
